## THE MATERIAL THEORY OF INDUCTION

John D. Norton

## The inaugural title in the new Open Access series BSPS Open, *The Material Theory of Induction* will initiate a new tradition in the analysis of inductive inference.

The fundamental burden of a theory of inductive inference is to determine which are the good inductive inferences or relations of inductive support and why it is that they are so. The traditional approach is modeled on that taken in accounts of deductive inference. It seeks universally applicable schemas or rules or a single formal device, such as the probability calculus. After millennia of halting efforts, none of these approaches has been unequivocally successful and debates between approaches persist.

The Material Theory of Induction identifies the source of these enduring problems in the assumption taken at the outset: that inductive inference can be accommodated by a single formal account with universal applicability. Instead, it argues that there is no single, universally applicable formal account. Rather, each domain has an inductive logic native to it. The content of that logic and where it can be applied are determined by the facts prevailing in that domain

Paying close attention to how inductive inference is conducted in science and copiously illustrated with real-world examples, *The Material Theory of Induction* will initiate a new tradition in the analysis of inductive inference.

JOHN D. NORTON is a distinguished professor in the Department of History and Philosophy of Science at the University of Pittsburgh. He is co-founder of PhilSci-Archive, a preprint server in the philosophy of science, and of &HPS, a conference series in the integrated history and philosophy of science.

## THE AMERICAN WESTERN IN CANADIAN LITERATURE Joel Deshave

## The first historically broad and in-depth study of the Canadian Western, its relationship to the American genre, and its shifting place within Canada's national and regional literary traditions.

As an American genre, the Western has achieved worldwide success. Cultures around the world have embraced but also adapted and critiqued the Western as part of their own national literatures. Canadian Westerns are almost always in conversation with their American cousins, influenced by their tropes and traditions, responding to their politics, and repurposing their structures to create a national literary tradition.

The American Western in Canadian Literature examines over a century of the development of the Canadian Western as it responds to the American Western, to evolving literary trends, and to regional, national, and international change. It includes overviews of Indigenous and settler-colonial responses to the Western, illuminates the ways the genre critiques and idealizes Canadian culture, and asks how the Western has evolved in the face of increasingly pressing issues such as climate change.

Pushing the boundaries to include Northerns, Northwesterns, and post-Westerns in literature, film, and cultural imagery, *The American Western in Canadian Literature* is more than a simple history. It is a comprehensive, fascinating, and compulsively readable guide to an underexamined genre.

## THE JOINT ARCTIC WEATHER STATIONS

Science and Sovereignty in the High Arctic, 1946-1972 Daniel Heidt and P. Whitney Lackenbauer

## The first comprehensive study of the Canada-U.S. Joint Arctic Weather Stations, systematically analyzing large- and small-scale aspects from scientific diplomacy to site logistics to understand how these isolated posts were so successful.

The Joint Arctic Weather Stations were five meteorological and scientific monitoring stations constructed at Resolute, Eureka, Mould Bay, Isachsen, and Alert between 1947-1950 with the cooperation of the Canadian Department of Transport's meteorological branch and the United States Weather Bureau.

This is the first systematic account of the Joint Arctic Weather Stations, a project that profoundly shaped state activities and scientific inquiry in the Arctic Archipelago. Drawing on extensive archival evidence, unpublished personal memoirs, and interviews with former employees, *The Joint Arctic Weather Stations* analyzes the diplomatic, scientific, social, military, and environmental dimensions of the program alongside each station as a nexus of state planning and personal agency. It explores the changing ways science was conducted over time and how the details of everyday life at remote stations, from the climate to leisure activities to debates over alcohol, hunting, and leadership, shaped the program's effectiveness.

An exploration of the full duration of the Joint Arctic Weather Stations from macro planning and diplomacy to micro interactions makes this book is an essential exploration of collaborative polar science in the North American Arctic.

Bound by loyalty and lies, stalked by a vicious shadow, the kid called Chatter must trace a path forward as death trails relentlessly behind.

rob mclennan

## rob mclennan presents a collection of sharp, challenging prose poetry that asks what can be achieved if we try a little smaller.

Written while at home full-time with two small children under five, the book of smaller is a collection of short, sharp, incredibly dense prose poems. Created in moments snatched from chaos, these poems challenge the possibilities of language in very small spaces.

Each poem is a still moment, a memory, a burst of observation, suspended outside time and held up to the light as the world whirls around it. Some are intimate, some are public, all are grounded personal, domestic space. With trademark intelligence and daring, rob mclennan uses radical structures to express the concision and disorientation, jumps in sense and mood, the collapse of time and duration, the shattering joy and powerful fears, of full-person, fulltime parenthood.

With an unparalleled knowledge of modern poetry and poetic evolution, mclennan breaks the sentence into its most vital pieces, then breaks it further, smashes punctuation out of the expected into spaces of risk and uncertainty, pushing conventions to the edge and then beyond to challenge what writing is, and what a reader can be.

## AN ORCHID ASTRONOMY

# A five-pointed, language-infused star map cataloging a migrating requiem of memories, mythologies, and science in the face of climate catastrophe and personal collapse.

Sophie grew up in Veslefjord, deep in the Norwegian North, where the ice stretches to the horizon and the long Arctic night is filled with stories about the animals of the sea, ice, and sky. Now the ice is melting and the animals are dying. Sophie's mother is also dead, leaving behind a daughter and a lover on the melting permafrost.

An Orchid Astronomy is the story of Sophie, of her personal trauma and of climate catastrophe, told in striking experimental poetry. Crossing poetic styles and genres, words and sentences flow and break, twist into images, and cluster together like the Arctic stars. Coming together in a sustained narrative, these poems ask how we grapple with magnificent loss, searching for solutions in science, in mythology, in storytelling and, ultimately, in our relived memories.

Challenging, powerful, and beautiful, *An Orchid Astronomy* wrestles with the grief we feel for the loss of those we love and grief for the changing world. In the language of mass extinction and the unknowable sky, Tasnuva Hayden fearlessly explores the nuances of personal collapse, sublimated desire, unfulfilled longing, and the ways we must move forward in the face of the impossible in poetry that dazzles like the moon on a midwinter night.

Based in the rural hamlet of Benalto, near Red Deer, Alberta, he is part of a generation of landscape artists who emerged in the 1970s to make beauty out of the ordinary and challenge the expected with bold acts of creation. Throughout his career, More has returned to the garden as a deeply functional, yet ritualistic space of human endeavor.

*Greatest Garden* is a celebration of David More's engagement with the garden as a multifaceted subject. Featuring over fifty original artworks, this book encompasses a career spent in conversation with gardens in their many and varied forms. With lively brushwork, a keen sense of colour, and an aptitude for expressive drawing and varied composition, More has found the garden in expected and unexpected places.
